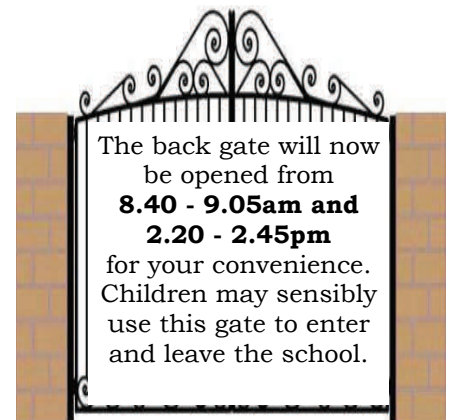

LEVEL BEHAVIOUR SYSTEM

Next week we begin our level system as part of our updated Welfare/Behaviour Policy. It is a simple system that sees all children begin on **Green Level**. Children who remain on Green Level for a majority of the term will have a special reward at the end of each term and a larger reward at the end of the year.

Minor misbehaviours will result in children being placed on **Yellow Level**. These behaviours include repeated misbehaviour in class and low level playground incidents. Children placed on Yellow Level will receive up to 2 days lunch detention and a letter will be sent home to parents.

Misbehaviour whilst on Yellow Level, aggressive behaviour and swearing will lead to a child being placed on **Orange Level**. While on Orange Level children will have 3 days lunch detention and their parents will be asked to school to speak with an executive teacher. Children on Orange Level may not be able to attend excursions or school sporting events.

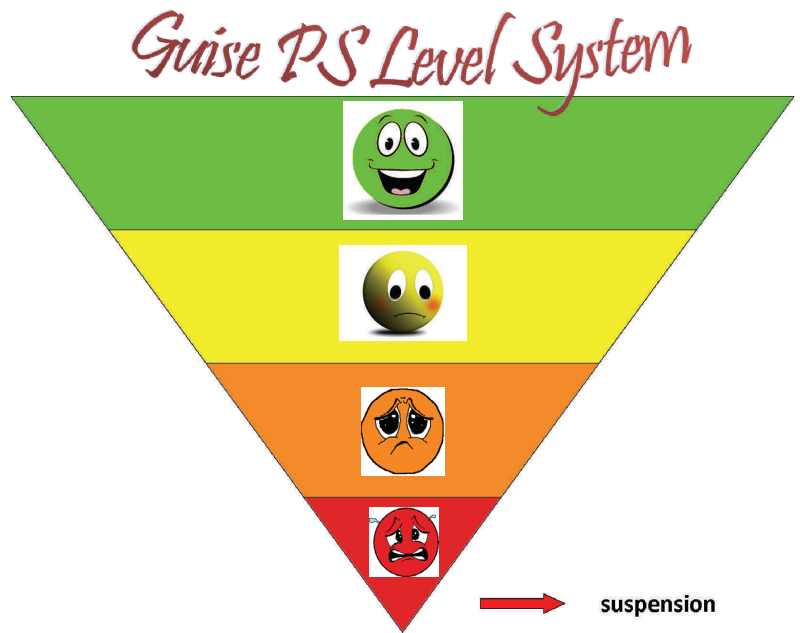
The final negative level is **Red Level**. Children who misbehave while on Orange Level will move to Red Level as will children who display violent behaviour. While on Red Level children will have 5 days recess and lunch detention, their parents will be called for an interview and they will not be allowed to attend any excursions or school events during this time.

If a child's behaviour continues to be inappropriate they may be **suspended** from school for up to 20 days.

This system is designed to allow children a chance to improve their behaviour at any point. All levels last for 5 days if a child is demonstrating correct behaviour during this time. Only an executive may place a child onto a negative level and will only do so after ensuring that any incident is investigated fully and children who may require individual behaviour plans have had all steps put in place to lessen the likelihood of an incident.

We strongly suggest you discuss this system with your child and how they can make good choices regarding their behaviour. As always, the school looks forward to working with parents to ensure the safety and learning of all children within the school.
