Year 7 Selective High School for 2022

If you have a child currently in Year 5 and are thinking about applying for government Selective High School for Year 7 entry for 2022, the application website is now open. Selective high schools cater for high achieving, academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level. As was outlined on the "Intention to Apply" note that was sent home to all Year 5 students last term, you must apply online at

- Applications can be made online between 6 October 2020 and 9 November 2020. Applications will not be accepted after 9 November 2020.
- All applicants are required to sit the Selective High School Placement Test to be held on Thursday 11 March 2021.

Do you have our Seesaw app?

What is Seesaw?

- Seesaw is a simple way for teachers and students to record and share what's happening in the classroom
- ✓ Seesaw gives students a place to document their learning, be creative and learn how to use technology.
- Each student receives their own journal and will add things to it, like photos, videos, drawings, or notes
- ✓ When there are new Seesaw posts, families can be notified via app notification, email or SMS.
- Parents are only notified about their own child's work, and all data is safe and secure.

How do I connect to my child's Seesaw journal?

Your child will have their own unique QR code that was sent home last term. Once you download the app to your device you will be able to connect to your child's journal by scanning the QR code. If you have lost or misplaced the QR code, feel free to ask at the front office or your child's classroom teacher for another copy.

Attendance

Missing school means your child misses out on vital information and maintaining learning routines. This can result in a loss of confidence and missing out on forming vital friendships.

Attendance is recorded each day. As a parent or caregiver you are responsible for ensuring your child attends school every day, unless your child:

- has an unavoidable medical or dental appointment (preferably these should be made after school or during holidays)
- is required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- is required to attend an exceptional or urgent family circumstance (such as attending a funeral)
- is sick, or has an infectious illness.

If your child has to be absent from school for any reason, including arriving late or leaving early, please explain the reason by phone or written note as soon as possible and within seven days.

Intention to apply for Year 7 placement in a selective high school in 2022



Dear Parent/Carer

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 11 March 2021.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2022, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available in late September 2020 at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7.

The application website opens at that link on 6 October 2020 and closes on 9 November 2020. You must apply before the closing date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after 6 October 2020.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

The tear-off slip below is not an application and the school cannot apply on your behalf.

Guise Public School asks that people making comments on the page show respect for their fellow users by ensuring the discussion remains civil. Comments are also subject to Facebook's Terms of Use and Code of Conduct. Remember that your name and photo will be seen next to your comment, visible to visitors to the page. We reserve the right, but assume no obligation, to hide or delete comments that are racist, sexist, abusive, profane, violent, obscene, spam, that advocate illegal activity, contain falsehoods or are wildly off-topic, or that libel, incite, threaten or make attacks on Guise Public School students, employees, guests or other individuals. Rationale:

Aim:

- 3. Make connecting with our school more convenient and accessible for our families.

Policy Statement:

Guise Public School reserves the right to block parents from using the schools Facebook site at the discretion of the school Principal. Where there are issues of a potentially serious criminal nature such as threats or inappropriate comments, the matter will be referred directly to the relevant governing body.

Guidelines:

- Guise Public School staff administrators of the GPS Facebook website are the only users who can

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
