What a fantastic fortnight we have had at Guise Public School celebrating the wonderful achievements of students in various school areas.

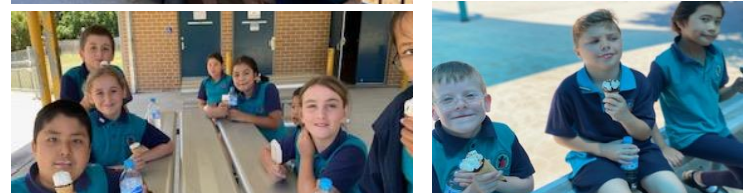
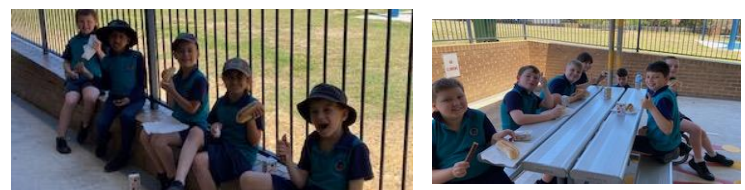
Presentation Days
